Public Health Advisor, USA

Dr. Ann Moen, MPA, is a public health expert who recently retired from the US CDC where she served as the Associate Director for Preparedness and Response, Influenza Division. Her expertise and support have extended nationally and internationally from policy development to capacity building. Ms. Moen was seconded to the World Health Organization from 2017 to 2021, where she served as the Chief of Influenza Preparedness and Response. In this role, she managed the Global Influenza Program and the PIP Framework Secretariat, providing strategic vision, planning, and technical expertise. Prior to that, Ms. Moen served as the Associate Director for the Extramural Program at CDC's Influenza Division, where she initiated and directed the international capacity-building program from 2004 to 2017. Ms. Moen started her work on influenza at CDC in 1999, as the Deputy Branch Chief. Before her CDC career, she worked for seven years as a public health advisor in Health Resources and Services Administration. Her public health career began as a Peace Corps Volunteer serving as a laboratory technician in rural Thailand.
