






Dr. Muhammed Badi Hassan, MBBS, MSc, MFPH

Head of Disease Surveillance and Response, Ministry of Health and Prevention, United Arab Emirates

Dr. Muhammed Badi Hassan, MBBS, MSc, MFPH, is the Head of Disease Surveillance and Response at the Ministry of Health and Prevention in the United Arab Emirates. With a special interest in epidemiology and disease control, Mr. Hassan has been instrumental in enhancing outbreak management capacities at national and local levels, and in establishing an operational framework for non-communicable disease and injury surveillance. Mr. Hassan has worked in Sudan and the UAE, and has contributed to the development of epidemic and pandemic preparedness plans, with a focus on strengthening responses to infectious and non-communicable diseases. In his current role, Mr. Hassan is responsible for overseeing the surveillance and response activities of the UAE Ministry of Health and Prevention, and is a strong advocate for evidence-based public health interventions to promote and protect the health of populations. He received his MBBS from the University of Gezira in Sudan in 1984, and later obtained an MSc in Community Health and Health Management from Heidelberg University in Germany in 1992. A Fellow of the UK Royal Society for Public Health since 2021, Mr. Hassan is also a Member of the Faculty of Public Health of the Royal College of Physicians of the United Kingdom, having obtained his Membership of the Faculty of Public Health (MFPH) in June 2016.
