Prior to his current role at EMRO, Noore worked as a Senior Consultant Epidemiologist with WHO HQ where he was the Contact Tracing and Quarantine Sub-Pillar Lead at COVID-19 IMST. In 2020-2021, he was seconded (from his substantive role at Queensland Health) to the Queensland (Australia) Government's COVID-19 Incident Management Team where he served as an Epidemiologist Team Lead. His various international roles (WHO, UNDP, WFP, UNTAC) ranged from capacity building in disease surveillance to epidemic response; from health services and systems improvement, including monitoring and evaluation framework development, to evidence review and policy development. He holds the degrees of Master of Applied Epidemiology from the Australian National University, Master of Public Health from the University of Sydney, Australia, and Master of Social Sciences (Sociology) with Honors from Dhaka University, Bangladesh.
